


**15th Annual

9:00-12:00 – For those who enjoy singing and simple choreography, you'll travel back in "Oliver" to 19<sup>th</sup> century England, where poor hungry, hardworking Oliver and other orphaned-children live in the workhouse. When Oliver decides to run away, he joins a group of street-urchin pickpockets led by the infamous Fagan. Some of the better-known songs include "Food, Glorious Food", "Consider Yourself One of the Family", and "It's a Fine Life". You'll also get to meet some of the cast members who played a role in the Broadway version of "Oliver" performed by the Grand Rapids Players in 1989.

12:30-3:30 – Zombie Apocalypse. This production includes a group of kids who've survived the apocalypse and are eager to share 10 ways to survive the next one, should it arrive. These roles invite character development and build stage presence as well as voice projection and articulation. There will be zombies a'plenty! A workshop day, hosted by Allie Hanson, will give kids a chance to design their own zombie costume.
